CroisiEurope Offering Free Cruises for Kids

Europe's largest river cruise line, CroisiEurope, has reaffirmed its family-friendly reputation by introducing [Family Club cruises](#), which allow children under 16 years old to sail for free on select cruises.

The new Family Club cruises also include a second cabin so that families can stay together on board.

In addition to meals, unlimited beverages and excursions, the program will also allow children to enjoy water games, activities and perform on each cruise's closing show.

For families seeking value in a vacation, the new Family Club offering is available on four of CroisiEurope's most popular itineraries, including Croatia and Montenegro; the Douro Valley and Salamanca; Andalusia; and Venice.

Travelers looking to head to Croatia and Montenegro on the eight-day cruises (from \$2,523 per person) will receive 30 percent off for children up to 16 years of age. As for journeys to Portugal and Spain, the six-day cultural cruises (from \$1,421 per person) will allow children up to 16 years of age to sail for free.

Tourists who are interested in a voyage to Andalusia will have the chance to enjoy the traditions, gastronomy and flamenco with their children, as they sail for free as part of the Family Club, with prices starting at \$1,805 per person for eight-day cruises.

Venice is another destination offering free cruises to children: It features six-day cultural cruises (from \$1,429 per person) that visit Venice, the Lagoon islands of Burano and Murano, Padua, Ferrara and Verona.
