Food and film in a famously fertile region.

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In the seaside town of Rimini, the Fulgor theater, where the hometown hero Federico Fellini watched his first films, will reopen (on Jan. 20, Fellini's birthday) as the Casa del Cinema, designed by the Oscar-winning production designer Dante Ferretti; a museum about the filmmaker is still in the works. And on the outskirts of Bologna, food lovers are celebrating **FICO Eataly World**, a new 25-acre homage to Italian cuisine. Explore its orchards, gardens, dozens of food production workshops, 97,000-square-foot market and some 40 restaurants and food stalls on foot — or borrow one of the custom-designed Bianchi tricycle/shopping carts.
