

10 Sites With Amazing Airline Deals Guaranteed to Get You Off the Couch

Who needs Netflix when deeply discounted flights to Rio, Rome, and beyond are waiting to be snapped up?

Every once in a while, you need to just get out of Dodge — and we're not talking about a road trip, we're talking about packing luggage, pulling out your passport, braving pat downs, and boarding an airplane. Where to? Anywhere will do. The Caribbean, Europe, maybe Asia. But where to find affordable flights? Here are 15 of the best sites to find amazing airline deals, so not only do you get to recharge your batteries, you save money while doing it. Happy travels!

1. Travelocity.com

What you'll find: Travelocity searches more than 400 airlines around the world for the lowest cost flights, so there are always interesting destinations popping up. Be sure to check out its "Today's Great Flight Deals" section (a recent search saw a roundtrip ticket from New York to Barcelona on Finnair for \$415), and its 24/7 social media assistance is a nice perk.

2. Airfarewatchdog.com

What you'll find: This low airfare alert site covers all airlines (including Southwest), so there's always a deal to be had — especially if you're flexible and can fly at a moment's notice. Sign up for

its alerts (and you can even list your airline preference) and follow them on [Twitter](#) for even more immediate deals.

3. [Vayama.com](#)

What you'll find: Browse incredible airline deals right on the homepage, so you don't have to go clicking around to see awesome offerings. A recent search for flights to Asia turned up a China Eastern Airlines flight (San Francisco to China), starting at \$615, and a New-York-to-Taipei flight on Korean Air, starting at \$840.

4. [Cheapoair.com](#)

What you'll find: Click on "Last Minute Flights" to find the absolute cheapest rates (if you're interested in the destination, book it quickly, as you never know if the price will go up!). A roundtrip flight from Philadelphia to Orlando for \$108 was a recent sweet deal. There's also a toll-free number to call to hear about unpublished fares.

5. [Expedia.com](#)

What you'll find: Aside from a slew of daily deals available on the site, download the mobile app and take advantage of its many perks, including earning double Expedia+ points (that can be redeemed for future travel), and receiving travel alerts in case of a flight delay or a gate change.

6. [Kayak.com](#)

What you'll find: This quick and easy site gathers fares from other travel sites, so you have all the cheapest rates right at your fingertips (download [the app](#) for mobile-only deals). Have \$200 to spare and want to go out of town? Its fun 'Explore' feature lets you check out cities you can fly to for that amount (or less) and show you on Google Maps.

7. [Priceline.com](#)

What you'll find: Priceline's "Name Your Own Price" feature is handy for those who don't mind booking at the last minute, and are super flexible with their departure times. If you book within seven days of your departure, you could save up to 50% off published airfares (though a recent search of actual winning bidders showed an average of 20% savings).

8. [CheapCaribbean.com](#)

What you'll find: While you can search just for flights, you'll get better deals when it's part of a package. And who doesn't want to lie on a tropical beach in the Caribbean? Find the latest offerings under its "Nice Packages" tab — a recent offering for an all-inclusive in the Dominican Republic for five nights was going for \$869 (down from \$1,249).

9. [Bookit.com](#)

What you'll find: Download its [new app](#) for the latest deals, and if you sign up to receive the newsletter, you may qualify for \$150 in savings. On the site, click on the "Flight" tab and you'll see the popular destinations conveniently highlighted with their own links (Flights to Mexico, and, even more specifically, Flights to Cancun and so on, make it super easy to search).

10. [OneTravel.com](#)

What you'll find: Check the site for top airline deals (there's even a "Business Class Flights" tab), and you can also call the toll-free line for unpublished fares. You can also sign up for the OneTravel Visa credit card and earn six points for every dollar spent on OneTravel.com (redeem those points for flight, hotels or even car rentals).
