

Finnair Announces Long-Haul Winter Expansion

Finnair announced plans for new [long-haul routes](#) and [increased frequencies](#) for the winter season.

The carrier will operate a twice-weekly service to the Indian coastal city of Goa (GOI) Nov. 30-March 18, 2018. Finnair will also increase the frequency of its Delhi (DEL) service to six flights per week.

"With the expected arrival of four new Airbus A350 aircraft in 2017, we are pressing ahead with our growth strategy," said Juha Jarvinen, chief commercial officer, Finnair. "The newest additions will offer even more travel options and flexibility for our customers traveling between Asia and Europe through our efficient Helsinki airport hub which guarantees a short and smooth connection."

The airline will fly twice weekly to Havana (HAV) between Dec. 1-March 23; weekly to Puerto Vallarta (PVR) between Nov. 19-March 18; and weekly to Puerto Plata (POP) Nov. 30-March 22.

Finnair is increasing frequencies on the following routes during the winter season as well: two additional weekly services to Bangkok (BKK) totaling 16 flights per week; two additional weekly services to Singapore (SIN); and three additional weekly services to Hong Kong (HKG) bringing frequencies to 10 flights per week year-round.

The airline recently announced an expanded codeshare agreement with [Flybe](#) allowing customers to book Finnair flights departing from 11 U.K. airports.
