





The first two days will be spent in Delhi, where travelers will immerse themselves in a blend of modern and ancient India, from visiting the famous Raj Ghat memorial site of Mahatma Gandhi to taking an NGO-guided tour of the Nizamuddin basti, a medieval colony containing the tomb of a Muslim Sufi mystic. On the third day, visitors depart for Agra, where they will spend two days exploring the city and the Agra Fort, enjoying Hi Tea with a local family and a heritage walk through the fascinating Kacchpura Village. Guests will marvel at the stunning vista of the region's iconic Taj Mahal, a monument of enduring love. After a brief excursion to the mysterious ghost town of Fatehpur Sikri on the fifth day, travelers come to Ranthambore. Considered by many to be one of India's most beautiful National Parks, Ranthambore's diverse series of high escarpments, forests, high lakes and scrub house a plethora of birds and mammals, including the reserve's famous tigers, which travelers are likely to see on the game drives.

On the seventh day, the trip comes to Rajasthan's capital, the pink city of Jaipur. Here visitors will spend two days marveling at the iconic sites of the Amber Fort, Palace of the Winds and Royal Observatory while the more adventurous will relish an elephant safari at Dera Amber and an optional hot air balloon ride over the city. Moving on to the charming city of Nimaj, guests will spend two days in the Chhatra Sagar luxury tented campsite, an important aspect of the nomadic Rajput lifestyle, while enjoying the relative peace of wildlife viewing and conversations with eco-conscious locals. On the eleventh day, the trip departs for the exotic locale of Jaisalmer, where guests will be enchanted by their stay at The Serai, a luxury tent complex including air-conditioned suites, a swimming pool, spa, lounge areas and organic gardens. These accommodations provide a welcome oasis for travelers returning from extensive tours of Jaisalmer's enormous fort, which houses a quarter of the city's population, or camel rides and jeep safaris along the dunes.

On the thirteenth day, travelers depart for Rohet, stopping in route to visit the famous Mehrangarh Fort at Jodhpur. At Rohet, travelers will be ensconced in the Mihirigarh, a luxurious desert fortress decorated in a combined Moroccan, African and Rajasthani motif, surrounded by open-air courtyards and terraces. The best of the land is showcased by a Bishnoi village safari, where guests will be welcomed by warm-hearted conservationists dedicated to protecting the natural environment.

After a brief visit to the famous white marble Jain temples at Ranakpur, the journey at last ends in Udaipur, widely considered to be one of the most beautiful cities in India. Here travelers will spend an entire day sightseeing, from exploring the Jagdish Temple and museums housed within the vibrant City Palace, to supporting the local tongawallahs by taking a carriage ride, to enjoying a leisurely boat cruise across Lake Pichola and an evening glass of wine with a renowned local contemporary artist.
