Home to five public markets, all open on weekdays, Montréal showcases fresh produce and products from all over Canada's Quebec province. In autumn, as the city's trees change colors and rain mixes with wintry temperatures, these offer the perfect opportunity to explore local flavor away (or at least covered) from the elements.

Start at Jean-Talon Market (Marché Jean-Talon) in Little Italy, for an abundance of vibrant vegetables and international pastries, then head to Atwater Market (Marché Atwater) for a variety of lunch options and an Instagram-worthy pumpkin patch.

Both markets opened in 1933 and offer an array of produce farmers, cheese purveyors, butchers, flower vendors, and of course, maple products. Jean-Talon is renowned for its size and variety of vegetables, while Atwater has a slew of meats among several butchers lining the main building.
