### Napa

Feel good about savoring summer's favorite sip during Sterling Vineyard's second annual [Napa Valley RoséFest](#) on June 9. Held in partnership with the Susan G. Komen foundation, the flavorful event celebrates the region's bounty while also benefiting breast cancer education, research and patient support.

This year's edition will feature tastes from more than 30 wineries alongside some of the Bay Area's best bites, live music and spectacular scenery from the vineyard's hilltop position.
