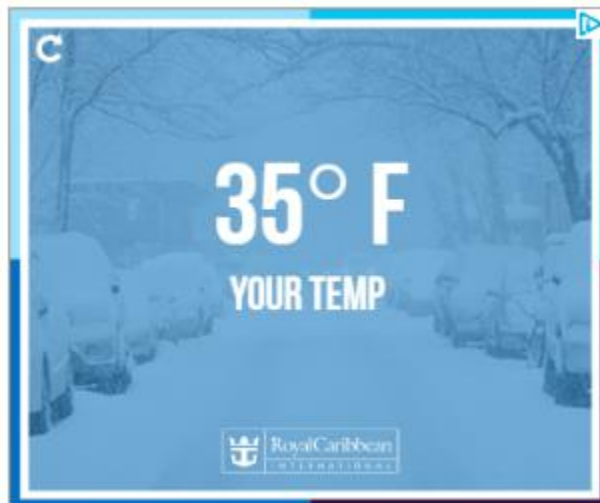


The high seas are riding the wave of all that's trending on land—skydiving and ice bars included.
