Aeromexico & Boeing to Make History with First Transcontinental Flight Using Biofuel

While European airlines KLM, Lufthansa, and Finnair have been dukeing it out over who can get the first regular, biofuel route started, North American airlines have been keeping a low-profile when it comes to switching to biofuels—until now. Aeromexico, Boeing, and the Mexican Government announced today the first transcontinental flight, powered by a General Electric engine, in a commercial airplane using biofuel.

The flight, using a 70 percent traditional fuel and 30 percent biofuel, will fly 250 passengers from Mexico City to Madrid.
